Elevators, Vehicles	Use only if "all individuals are wearing face coverings. If occupied by more than one person, keep occupancy under 50% of maximum capacity." Restrooms	"Tightly confined spaces will be occupied by only one individual at a time, unless all occupants are wearing face coverings. If occupied by more than one person, will keep occupancy under 50% of maximum capacityAdhere to hygiene and sanitation requirements from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Department of Health (DOH) and maintain cleaning logs on site that document date, time, and scope of cleaningProvide and maintain hand hygiene stations for personnel [and guests], including handwashing with soap, water, and paper towels, or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing 60% or more alcohol for areas where handwashing is not feasibleConduct regular cleaning and disinfection at least after every shift, daily, or more frequently as needed, and frequent cleaning and disinfection of shared objects (e.g. tools, machinery) and surfaces, as well as high transit areas, such as restrooms and common areas, must be completed." Heating and Filtering Systems Sanctuary

NYS provides no guidance.

Churches may consult with their department of health and their HVAC vendor to explore options.

Beginning in October, NYS also started using https://forward.ny.gov/ the "COVID-19 Micro-Cluster Strategy" which may impact areas in UNY with increasing infection numbers. This initiative identifies smaller regions or "micro-clusters" based on infection rates: red, orange, and yellow. Each type of mico-cluster must adhere to particular COVID rules and restrictions:

Red: lessor of 25% of maximum capacity or 10 people.

Orange: lessor of 33% of maximum capacity or 25 people

Yellow: 50% of maximum capacity.

Drop offs and Pick ups

"Establish designated areas for pickups and deliveries."

Health Screening

"Implement mandatory health screening assessment (e.g., questionnaire, temperature check) for employees, faith leaders, and volunteers (but not attendees), asking about (1) COVID-19 symptoms in past 14 days, (2) positive COVID-19 test in past 14 days, and/or (3) close contact with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case in past 14 days. Responses must be reviewed and such review must be documented." NOTE: persons who screen positive for COVID-19 symptoms must not be allowed to enter building. Send person home with instructions to contact healthcare provider. Also, notify local health department and follow prescribed contact tracing protocol, including maintaining appropriate confidentiality requirements.

No other guidance.

Implement mandatory health screening assessment (e.g. questionaire, temperature check) for employees of churches, faith leaders and volunteers who will be assisting with ministries, asking about 1. COVID19 symptoms in the past 14 days, 2. positive COVID19 test in the past 14 days, and/or 3. close contact with a confirmed or suspected COVID19 case in past 14 days, 4. if having traveled to a state/teritory on the restricted travel list (if yes - self quarantine for 14 days). Utilize the health questionaire provided by the UNY Conference. NOTE: persons who screen positive for COVID19 symptoms must not be allowed to enter the building. Send person home with instructions to contact healthcare provider. Also, notify local health department and follow prescribed contact tracing protocol, including maintaining appropriate confidientiality requirments.

Worship

Handshakes/Hugging/ Passing of the Peace

"Prohibit holding or shaking hands of members in different households during the services or prayers."

Congregants should engage in friendly gestures that don't involve touching to greet one another. Waving, bowing, salutes, heart hands, prayer hands, and jazz hands are all acceptable substitutes.

Masks

"Any time employees, volunteers, and/or attendees must come within 6 ft of one another (or 12 ft., if singing), they must wear acceptable face coverings, unless they are members of the same household." Everyone "must be prepared to don a face covering if another person unexpectedly comes within 6 ft. (e.g., when walking to seats)."

If people are working, meeting, or worshipping together in shared space, it is recommended that they wear masks as much as possible. Individuals working alone in offices/rooms can remove their masks, though if someone else wishes to speak with them in the room, they should don their masks

Shared objects (communion ware, hymnals)

"Limit the sharing of objects (e.g., religious texts, collection plates) as well as teh touching of shared surfaces (e.g. pews, instruments, doors, railings); or, require individuals to wear gloves when in contact with shared objects or frequently touched surfaces; or, require individuals to santize or wash hands before and after contact."

Hymnal use: 1) disinfect with cleaner between church services. 2) hymnals are not used after worship until next Sunday. This would include for funerals or weddings (or other services between Sundays); This also assumes no one shared hymnals or bible during the service. Each person must have their own hymnal or bible; 3) hymnal alternatives: printing music in the week's bulletin, projecting lyrics on screen/tv (where possible). Collection Plates: Have a few designated locations for collection plates where people can put their offerings rather than passing the collection plate. Wipe down shared surfaces weekly between uses. Utilize gloves if touching shared objects is necessary, or have one designated person hold the object while another uses it (i.e. microphones)

Holy Communion

Baptism

Singing (choirs, vocalists)

be provided between individuals or additional distancing or physical barriers can reduce transmission of respiratory droplets."

Singing (congregational)

....any singing activity must provide for a distance If singing is taking place, masks MUST be worn by the singers. between individuals of 12 ft., subject to additional protective measures."

Outdoor Worship

"For any religious or funeral service, limit the congregant/attendee capacity to: Phase 1 regions: no more than 10 people indoors or outdoors: Phase 2 and 3 regions: no more than 25 people for services occuring outdoor; Phase 4 regions: no more than 50 people for services occuring outdoor."

Attendees and family groups should sit at least 6 ft apart from one another during outdoor worship.
